Problem-Based Learning Exercise #1

Non-Emergency Incident Response

Trainee: Dep. Tiffany Goodwin

Date: 01/02/14

PBLE #1: Vehicle Stop

You and your partner stop a car on a busy street with a great deal of pedestrian and vehicular traffic. You have stopped the car for speeding in a school zone. Upon stopping the vehicle you notice the passengers in the rear seats strapping on their seatbelts. As you approach the vehicle, you note the windows are down and you hear agitated voices. All occupants of the vehicle are from the same minority ethnic group. The passenger in the front seat complains loudly to the others about racial profiling. At this point he has not seen you. Several passers-by have stopped to watch the event. Upon request, the driver produces identification, but the passengers are argumentative and refuse to identify themselves.

Directions for PBLE: Remember, this is an ill-structured problem and does not have a simple solution. You must present to your Police Training Officer two or more possible outcomes for this exercise. In each instance you must include the following:

Ideas – Record initial responses to the problem. What are two separate possible ways you can deal with this situation? Explain them to your PTO.

- What are your initial thoughts on solving this problem?

Explain some examples on why I have asked every person in the vehicle for identification.

1. My safety as an officer.
2. The safety of all passengers.
3. Make sure no one has active warrants.
4. Make sure no one could be kidnapped or being held against their will.

Explain that there was no racial profiling, for the simple fact I did not see who was driving the vehicle as it was speeding passed me.

- What are the issues?

The spot the traffic stop had been conducted in. The passengers are not being compliant. Too many passers are gathering around the scene. A racial conflict.

Facts – List all of the known facts about the problem. For example, you are in a school zone; the passengers in the vehicle will not provide identification.

- What do you know?

I am in a school zone. Kids are present at the school. People are walking to the school, while there are vehicles speeding through causing an issue. I have stopped this car in the middle of a busy traffic flow during school hours. I know who the driver is because he provided his information.

- What are your facts?

The vehicle is speeding, it is school hours, children are present so it enforces the school zone speed, now that I have made contact with the driver, I know all occupants are from a local minority.

Learning Issues – Identify the relevant content from the learning matrix for each decision. For example, what do you know about racial profiling and what conflict resolution skills are most appropriate in this circumstance?

- What do you need to know to solve this problem?

What the law says about carrying identification and what the department policies are.

- Where can you find it?

The law can be found online or in a TCA book. The policies can be found in the policy manual in the office or on the copy we, deputies have.

- Whom should you contact?

I can call my Supervisor for further assistance.

- What resources are available to solve this problem?

The Supervisor, the training department, department policy procedure manual, and the TCA Handbook.

- What other information do you need?

I need to make sure the driver has a valid driver's license, make sure the vehicle has valid proof of insurance and the registration to the vehicle. I need the passenger's information to determine who they are.

Action Plans – Create a precise and specific plan for either solving or reducing the problem. Your action plan should arise from what you know about the problem and what your research has taught you. For example, once you speak to a variety of individuals and carry out your research during the "learning issues phase," what plan can you now develop, using the new information you have, to help you deal effectively with this problem?

- What can you do to solve or reduce this problem?

I call for backup to assist with the crowd, for traffic control and for further investigation with the passengers. We can ask the driver to step out so we can ask him questions one on one without having to deal with the others.

- Do you make arrests?

Depending on the circumstances. If we have reasonable suspicion to ask for consent to search the vehicle and if we find any type of narcotics, or if we finally get the passenger's information and if they have any active warrants.

- Describe the rationale for each decision.

If we do not get consent to search the vehicle, I can ask for a K9 to come out. We can detain the ones who are not giving information, until we can figure out who they are.

- Describe the possible consequences of each decision in your action plan.

If there is no K9 working, we will not be able to search the vehicle. Making an arrest or detaining the passengers can start an even bigger racial issue. But if there is not an arrest made, we could let a possible fugitive go on the loose, or let a large amount of narcotics out of sight in our community.

I would keep this traffic stop professional as possible. I would keep a calm temper. Just continue to ask questions.

You will, in consultation with your PTO, determine the best method to present solutions to this problem. These may include a verbal report, a written report, a formal presentation, demonstrations incorporating examples from your patrol work with your PTO, or other methods that best suit your abilities.

The method of presentation will be

Using your matrix, answer the following questions for this problem:

1. What did you learn from this problem? Use specific examples and refer to the cells in the matrix. Describe the Core Competencies that you developed during the exercise.

- Trainee comments:

I learned that when conducting a traffic stop, you must be aware of the surroundings. Making sure that you as well as the occupants are safe during the stop. Make sure it is not causing a hazard to the flow of traffic. You have to have good communication/negotiating skills.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin used the matrix to reflect back on this stop. She noticed that vehicle operation and positioning would have made the scene safer. In addition it could give her more of an advantage and control of the suspect if she needed them to step out of the car for confidential questioning.

2. Did you initially formulate assumptions (ideas) that you later realized would not work? Explain. Could these assumptions be transferred to another problem? Where?

- Trainee comments:

I do not believe that any problems came out of this. There will always be problems like this during this career.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin seemed to have good ideas and actions throughout this exercise. She didn't have any bad ideas that I seen.

3. Identify important information or skills that you acquired during this problem-solving exercise. Explain why you choose these (i.e. identify laws, contacts, or behaviors that you will use again).

- Trainee comments:

The TCA law dealing with Identification will help during this career.

- PTO comment:

TCA laws are good to research on this incident. Also knowing your resources could be beneficial, such as additional officers for crowd control, detectives for specialty questioning, K-9 for vehicle search, and possibly supervisor if needed.

- Trainee comments:

I listed all known facts to my knowledge. I asked all the helpful questions that could have solved the problem. If there was an odor coming from the inside of the vehicle. If any of the subjects were on probation or have any criminal history or where they were headed to, why they were driving through a school zone. My action plan was realistic and could possibly be achievable.

- PTO comments:

Dep. Goodwin has a good understanding of what her resources are when dealing with an issue. She is usually good about asking the necessary questions.

5. What competencies, skills, community contacts, and knowledge do you need to improve or develop more fully to deal with this type of problem in the future? Explain and indicate how you intend to improve or develop these.

- Trainee comments:

I could have the School Resource Officer to keep check on suspicious vehicles in the area. Developing more problem solutions from a supervisor could be of some use. Knowing the laws and what I need to do or what I could charge them with at the end of this stop.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin needs to work on setting up contacts in the community. Having contacts in the community could benefit her in this circumstance.

Emergency Incident Response

Trainee: Deputy Tiffany Goodwin

Date: 01/26/14

PBLE #2: Disorderly at Bar Call

You are on solo patrol at 1:00 a.m. You receive a radio call from a bar owner on the opposite side of your patrol area. He reports that an extremely agitated person has destroyed property in the bar and driven off without paying. The owner believes the driver also struck another vehicle in the parking lot as he sped off. The bar owner reports the driver and one female passenger as occupants of the vehicle. You respond to the call and, while en route to the bar, you observe that the suspect's vehicle has struck another car and is stalled in the middle of the road. Both driver and passenger are still in the vehicle. Back-up officers are en route.

Directions for PBLE: Remember, this is an ill-structured problem and does not have a simple solution. You must present to your Police Training Officer two or more possible outcomes for this exercise. In each instance you must include the following:

Ideas – Record initial responses to the problem. What are two separate possible ways you can deal with this situation? Explain them to your PTO.

- What are your initial thoughts on solving this problem?

I would stay with the driver and assist him, make sure he and the female are okay. Get his information and his side of the story. Tell the backup to continue on to the bar. Wait on someone to get to me, and if I notice that he has been drinking, I will perform field sobriety. After speaking with the bar owner, decide whether an arrest needs to be made or not.

- What are the issues?

Possible drunk has destroyed property inside the bar, the male did not pay, and he has left the bar, possibly has left the scene of an accident, male has struck a vehicle in the road.

Facts – List all of the known facts about the problem. For example, there has been at least one motor vehicle accident, a complaint about a bar fight, and the suspects are in a vehicle.

- What do you know?

I know that the bar owner has called in and reported damage to his bar. I know the description of the vehicle and the occupants, I observe the suspect's vehicle in a collision with a vehicle.

- What are your facts?

The driver has left the bar without paying and has destroyed property inside. The description of the vehicle and the occupants. The driver has wrecked into a vehicle.

Learning Issues – Identify the relevant content from the learning matrix for each decision. For example, what laws do you need to know and what are the procedures for vehicle stops and impounding vehicles?

- What do you need to know to solve this problem?

The amount of damage done inside the bar, if the male has hit a vehicle in the parking lot of the bar, if the driver has a valid license. Laws on property damage, hit and runs.

Investigate for the info I need by speaking with all parties, ask dispatch, TCA books.

- Whom should you contact?

A traffic officer, to work the crash.

- What resources are available to solve this problem?

Investigation, dispatch, TCA book.

- What other information do you need?

The amount of the bar tab, the bar owner's information, amount of damage done to the vehicles, both vehicle owners information, their insurance information, the females information that is in the vehicle with the male. Have the on-call wrecker in route.

Action Plans – Create a precise and specific plan for either solving or reducing the problem. Your action plan should arise from what you know about the problem and what your research has taught you. For example, once you speak to a variety of individuals and carry out your research during the "learning issues phase," what plan can you now develop, using the new information you have, to help you deal effectively with this problem?

- What can you do to solve or reduce this problem?

Speak with all parties and get statements from witnesses.

- Do you make arrests?

According to the TCA Laws an arrest could possibly be made.

- Describe the rationale for each decision.

Arresting the male, would result in him being charged with hit and run, property damage, theft of services.

- Describe the possible consequences of each decision in your action plan.

The male may be banned from this bar.

- Describe how you would behave given each set of circumstances.

I would keep it as professional as possible.

You will, in consultation with your PTO, determine the best method to present solutions to this problem. These may include a verbal report, a written report, a formal presentation, demonstrations incorporating examples from your patrol work with your PTO, or other methods that best suit your abilities.

The method of presentation will be

Using your matrix, answer the following questions for this problem:

- Trainee comments:

If there is not a traffic officer working, I will learn to get better at a crash report. Traffic codes will definitely help during this incident. This was not an emergency call so there was no use to run lights/sirens.

- PTO comments:

Due to the nature of this call and the fact that the unwanted subject has left the incident scene and that there are no injuries, Deputy Goodwin knows that she would respond non-emergency. Deputy Goodwin also knows that she needs to stay with the accident scene and suspect.

2. Did you initially formulate assumptions (ideas) that you later realized would not work? Explain. Could these assumptions be transferred to another problem? Where?

- Trainee comments:

I did not have any bad ideas during this incident.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin produced good ideas and action plans on this incident.

3. Identify important information or skills that you acquired during this problem-solving exercise. Explain why you choose these (i.e. identify laws, contacts, or behaviors that you will use again).

- Trainee comments:

The traffic TCA book would help for the laws if it is a hit-an-run, if he has no valid driver's license or no insurance for the vehicle. I will have to contact dispatch to put it on the record that whether the bar owner wants him banned or not. These TCA laws will be used throughout this career.

- PTO comment:

Deputy Goodwin seems to be getting better at recognizing the required resources on calls, identifying the proper TCA codes, and paperwork needed.

4. Evaluate your own problem-solving process regarding the listing of known facts, finding answers to questions and devising the action plan. (Did you list all the facts? Did you ask the right questions? What questions would you ask now? Was your action plan realistic and achievable?)

- Trainee comments:

I listed all known facts to my knowledge. I asked all the helpful questions that could have solved the problem. I could ask the subjects if they have been in trouble with the police before. My action plan was realistic and could possibly be achievable.

- PTO comments:

I think Deputy Goodwin has a good action plan to achieve the overall outcome for this incident.

• Trainee comments:

I could do more patrolling around that area where the bar is located. It would be helpful to know who all of the owners of the bar are and have their contacts for the future. Being familiar with the area could also help. Developing more problem solutions from a supervisor could be of some use. Knowing the laws and what I need to do or what I could charge them with at the end of this stop.

• PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin knows the importance of having good connections in the community and having a good relationship with fellow deputies and supervisors.

INCIDENT RESPONSE NARRATIVE

Nature of Incident TRAFFIC STOP

Incident Case Number. 13-1 [REDACTED]

Date of Incident: 12/28/13

Narrative: (Describe the basic chain of events for the call)

ON 12/28/13, WHILE TRAVELING NORTH ON APD40, I OBSERVED A BLACK SUV TRAVELING AT A HIGH RATE OF SPEED. I CONFIRMED THE VEHICLE SPEEDING BY PACING AT 65 MPH. AFTER INITIATING A TRAFFIC STOP, I MADE CONTACT WITH THE DRIVER. [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT SHE DID NOT HAVE A LICENSE OR PROOF OF VALID INSURANCE. I CONFIRMED HER DL STATUS THROUGH NCIC TO BE SUSPENDED OUT OF BRADLEY COUNTY FOR NO FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY. [REDACTED] WAS THEN PLACED INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO JAIL.

CORE COMPETENCY DETAIL

1. Police Vehicle Operations

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

During this incident, when I initiated the traffic stop, the vehicle pulled to the left side of the road, after I made contact with the driver, I advised her to move to the right side for the safety of the driver and myself.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

On this traffic stop Deputy Goodwin paced the vehicle at a safe distance to match the speed. While in a highly visible straightaway she decided to initiate the stop. As she did the vehicle pulled into the median and was partly in the roadway. Deputy Goodwin requested that the car pull to the right side of the roadway for a proper traffic stop and patrol car placement.

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

With H [redacted] being suspended for no insurance, her driving history and currently without insurance [redacted] had been advised prior to this incident, if she was caught driving again she would be taken to jail. After I made contact with her, she told me she still did not have a license and no insurance. The results in this conflict, [redacted] was taken into custody.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

In this situation Deputy Goodwin had a driver with a suspended driver's license. It was suspended for not having insurance. The driver was still with out insurance on the vehicle. To resolve this matter, prevent the driver from further driving the uninsured vehicle, and possible getting into a motor vehicle accident, Deputy Goodwin made the arrest and towed the uninsured vehicle.

3. Use of Force

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

[redacted] was very compliant with the issue so there was no use of force.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin handled the traffic stop in a very professional manner and no use of force was needed.

4. Local Procedures

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

For the Speeding, I used the TCA 55-50-152. Driving while Suspended, 55-50-504, Financial Responsibility, 55-12-139. Due to the vehicle having no insurance, the vehicle was towed by North & South Towing. And she was transported to the jail.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin researched the proper TCA codes without any assistance and towed the uninsured vehicle.

5. Report Writing

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

With the vehicle having to be towed, a tow slip was filled out. For the arrest, an Affidavit of Complaint was filled out along with a Warrant. I [redacted] had provided an actual DL, I would have filled out a DL seizure. I [redacted] was just suspended and the vehicle had insurance, I would have issued her a citation and let her make a phone call for someone to come pick her up.

Deputy Goodwin knew that the paperwork on this incident would consist of the Affidavit of Complaint, an arrest warrant and a tow slip for the vehicle. She collected the necessary information for the report. She wrote a good and easy to read narrative, describing all the charges that were used. She needed very little assistance on the wording.

6. Leadership

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

I was able to make a decision to stop the vehicle for speeding past me. After speaking with the driver, I was able to make the decision whether she was going to be arrested or just issued a citation.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

On this stop Deputy Goodwin took the lead, decided to stop the car, and make contact. When she discovered that the driver was suspended Deputy Goodwin made the decision to make the arrest. She also made the decision to tow the vehicle due to no insurance rather than releasing it to a friend or family member.

For the safety of the driver and myself instead of keeping the vehicle parked in the median on the left side of the road, I advised [REDACTED] pull to the emergency lane, I arrested [REDACTED] to help prevent further problems, for an example, her getting into a wreck with no insurance.

- PIO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin recognized the problem to be the uninsured vehicle. She solved the matter by towing the vehicle to get it off of the roadway.

There was no community specific problem during this incident.

Narrative:

ON 1/6/14, I RESPONDED TO SKY RIDGE MEDICAL CENTER IN REFERENCE TO A DOMESTIC ASSAULT. UPON MY ARRIVAL, I SPOKE WITH THE VICTIM [REDACTED] [REDACTED] ADVISED ME THAT OVER THE PASSED FEW DAYS, HER HUSBAND [REDACTED] HAS BEEN ASSAULTING HER AND HITTING HER IN THE HEAD CAUSING KNOTS. [REDACTED] STATED THAT THIS MORNING WHILE SHE WAS SLEEPING, HER HUSBAND WOKE HER UP BY HITTING HER IN THE FOOT YELLING AT HER TO GET UP. [REDACTED] HAD BRUISING ON VARIOUS AREAS OF HER BODY AND KNOTS ON HER HEAD. I MADE CONTACT WITH [REDACTED] AT 625 PAULHUFF PRWY. MR. MILLS STATED THAT HE DID NOT HAVE ANY KNOWLEDGE OF AN ASSAULT. [REDACTED] WAS THEN PLACED INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE BRADLEY COUNTY JAIL.

CORE COMPETENCY DETAIL

1. Police Vehicle Operations:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

I responded non-emergency to the ER in reference to the incident. After responding to the other location, the male was parked sideways in the parking lot of Buffalo Wild Wings. I approached the vehicle tactically by positioning my patrol car facing the front of his vehicle that way I could see through the front window of the truck because the windows were dark tinted.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Due to the separation of the parties Deputy Goodwin responded to this call non-emergency, obeying the speed limits, using her turn signals, and wearing her seatbelt. When we approached the suspect's location and had contact, Deputy Goodwin parked at a tactical angle to his vehicle so that she could have a constant visual on the suspect as she had him step out.

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

After making contact with the male, I started the conversation casual. Asking if everything was okay, if he had someone to assist him with gas, asked for his ID, asked how long he had been out there and where he was headed. When he stated his wife was coming to get him, I asked how long she would be until she got there he said he didn't know because they had been arguing and she had left the house that morning without telling him where she was going. After asking questions about the argument, [REDACTED] continued to avoid the subject about any kind of assault taking place.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement

After making contact with the victim in the ER, Deputy Goodwin noticed that severity of the incident. Due to the physical evidence Deputy Goodwin made the decision to resolve the conflict by making the arrest for domestic assault.

3. Use of Force

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

I was able to have [REDACTED] get out of the vehicle and have him place his hands on top of the car while my partner Deputy Paul Singleton patted him down before I placed him into custody. There was no use of force needed in this situation.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement

While Deputy Goodwin made contact with the 6'00", 220lbs. male suspect, I watched from a distance to see how she would handle the encounter. Deputy Goodwin was able to talk to the subject civilly, keeping the situation from getting escalated. She was able to place the subject in custody without further conflict.

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4. Local Procedures

- Trainee's Comment: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

The law of any kind of assault is that if a person knowingly, intentionally causes bodily injury to another person or makes extreme physical contact. If a victim has visible evidence of an assault that has occurred, there is enough to support an arrest.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement

Deputy Goodwin went by the department procedures by making the arrest for domestic assault where signs of assault were visible. When placing the subject in custody he was cuffed from behind and being her male back up, I patted the suspect down for weapons. Deputy Goodwin knows that when she transports a male or juvenile that she needs to give her mileage before and after the transport.

5. Report Writing

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

We did not have to tow the vehicle since he said that he could have someone come get it and because it was not a hazard to traffic flow. Since we had contact with him we did not have to take out warrant for his arrest for domestic assault. He was found and placed in custody.

Tiffan OnÿhisÿiIH Deputy Goodwin collected all of her own information from the victim for her report and advised her of the domestic assault victim's rights. When she arrested the male suspect she collected his information. Her paperwork consisted of the arrest affidavit, warrant, and the victim notification form. Her affidavit was completed with little assistance on wording for the narrative.

When we got on scene at the ER, I took the lead role while getting all the information. Deputy Singleton allowed me to have controloveiÿhe situation (going hands on.) I showed professional maturity while speaking t

On this call Deputy Goodwin took the initiative. She made contact with all parties to get their stories to determine the outcome. After hearing the stories Deputy Goodwin and I stepped to the side to talk about the incident. She made the decision to arrest the suspect on the domestic assault charge.

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

While speaking with the victim, I advised her that she can take out an Order of Protection against and told her not to speak with him anymore to help solve this issue! was ta kyTTTTOTUS tody and charged with domestic assault against his v/lfe iouldai least get away from him for a little while and get her things together while he was in jail.

- PtiO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement

On this call Deputy Goodwin recognized the problem to me an ongoing domestic situation between husband and wife. She determined that the best outcome would be to make the arrest. This action would also prevent further conflict for the next twelve hour due to the mandatory twelve hour hold on domestic assaults.

8. Community Specific Problems

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

One of the most calls that we respond to in Bradley County are domestics. Whether they are verbal or if there has been an assault. Everyone has arguments with family, spouses, or children, we just need to identify if some of these calls are an on-going issue or if it is just a misunderstanding.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin notices that the domestic assault is the most answered call, but domestic calls can also impact the community if its being heard thought the neighborhood or if weapons are used.

There were no ethnic nor language differences.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin has not yet responded a call where cultural diversity was an issue.

During a domestic, I need to make sure that both parties understand the consequences of an arrest that could possibly be made. If there is no visible evidence, there's clearly no proof that an assault has occurred. If there is no evidence of assault to support an arrest, I can advise the parties that if they want, they can each take out warrants on each other and handle it in court.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin knew that due to the visible signs of an assault on the victim along with her statements she had the authority and obligation to make an arrest. After the arrest Dep. Goodwin had me search the suspect incident to arrest. Dep. Goodwin knows the difference between a simple assault and an aggravated assault and use 39-13-111 as a misdemeanor on this incident because a weapon was not use or displayed. Also the assault did not appear to be life threatening.

I always keep in mind that no matter what call I go to they are never the same as the last. So I always try to keep a calm mindset when going to talk to the other party when dealing with a domestic. I parked in front of the truck so I could keep an eye on him before I got out of my patrol car and so that I can have eyes on the suspect at all times at that way if he was to have a weapon we could still have cover and concealment.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin display good officer safety on this call. Before making contact with the suspect she got a physical description from the victim describing his size. When we arrived at the suspects location Deputy Goodwin parked at a tactical angle to his vehicle. She had the suspect step out of the vehicle and kept her distance. While speaking with the subject she was professional, not agitate the individual.

13. Communication Skill

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

I was able to calmly speak to [REDACTED] when I first walked up to the vehicle. He was calm and collected because I did not jump right into the reason of why I was really there. So being able to negotiate and use professional language. I checked him over dispatch to see if he was negative through NCIC.

ON 1/21/14, I RESPONDED TO [REDACTED] IN REFERENCE TO A DOMESTIC ASSAULT. UPON MY ARRIVAL, I SPOKE WITH [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] STATED THAT HIS GIRLFRIEND [REDACTED] HAD CAME TO HIS HOUSE TO RECOVER HER T.V. AND PS3 AFTER THEY HAD BEEN BROKEN UP. [REDACTED] STATED THAT [REDACTED] CAME INTO THE HOUSE AND BEGAN ASSAULTING HIM, SCRATCHING HIS CHEST AND ARMS. HE ALSO STATED HE GRABBED HER BY THE HEAD AND HELD HER DOWN ON THE COUCH TO DEFEND HIMSELF. [REDACTED] HAD LEFT THE SCENE PRIOR TO MY ARRIVAL. [REDACTED] HAD VISIBLE MARKS OF ASSAULT, SCRATCHES ON HIS ARMS, CHEST, BUSTED LIP AND A SWOLLEN EYE. [REDACTED] WAS LATER LOCATED AT [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] STATED THAT DURING THE ALTERCATING, [REDACTED] HELD HER DOWN BY CHOKING HER. DUE TO THE PHYSICAL SIGNS OF ASSAULT, [REDACTED] AND TWO WITNESSES STATEMENTS BY [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] WAS DETERMINED TO BE THE PRIMARY AGGRESSOR. MS. SUTTON WAS PLACED INTO CUSTODY AND TRANSPORTED TO THE BRADLEY COUNTY JAIL.

CORE COMPETENCY DETAIL

1. Police Vehicle Operations:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

The caller said that they heard a verbal disturbance going on outside and when they looked out, they saw the victim almost get hit by the suspect in her vehicle. They stated they saw her go in the house, come back out and speed off. Since the suspect had just left the scene, this put the domestic assault in progress. I used lights and sirens during this call. I made sure I was aware of my surroundings while in route, made sure I came to a stop at the stop signs before entering traffic and to make sure the other vehicles saw me, drove a safe speed but made sure I got there quickly.

PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

On this call deputy Goodwin responded emergency traffic (lights and sirens) do to the domestic assault in progress. While enroute she slowed at all intersections to allow motorists and pedestrians aware of her location. When we arrived on scene deputy Goodwin was unable to park in the driveway. She positioned the patrol car in the roadway in front of the residence and left the rear blue lights on, to alert passing motorists of her presence.

2. Conflict Resolution:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

My backup officer made contact with the female, she stated that the male had assaulted her but she was not showing visible evidence like the male was. I determined that the female was the primary aggressor in this incident. So with the signs off assault on the male [REDACTED] was taken into custody.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin noticed right away that this incident was a domestic assault. After getting both sides of the story, witness statements, and the visible signs of assault, deputy Goodwin resolved the conflict by making the arrest.

3. Use of Force:

There was no use of force needed during this incident.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

No use of force was observed on this call.

The law of any kind of assault is that if a person knowingly, intentionally causes bodily injury to another person or makes extreme physical contact. If a victim has visible evidence of an assault that has occurred, there is enough to support an arrest. Although the suspect had red marks on her chest, they corresponded with the victims and the witnesses statements. The victim had various signs of assault. I was able to determine [REDACTED] was the primary aggressor.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin is becoming more familiar with domestics and what to look for while on scene. She also knows that even though a simple domestic assault is a misdemeanor, she can still make the arrest after the parties are separated.

5. Report Writing:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

During this incident, the female had her child with her. Since [REDACTED] was found there was no warrants taken out on her for domestic assault. One of the backup deputies was able to make contact with [REDACTED] at her mothers business so she was there to take the child into her care.

On this call deputy Goodwin collected all the necessary information for the report. She had the two witnesses on scene write statements to support her arrest. For her paperwork she did the affidavit, warrant, victim notification, and the TIBRS report.

6. Leadership:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

After arriving on scene, I got the victim's information as well as two statements from the witnesses. And was able to get an address where the suspect was headed. I advised one of the back-up deputies where she could possibly be, so he left to go and try to make contact with her. I showed professional maturity while speaking with all parties.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

When we arrived on scene deputy Goodwin took the lead and made contact with victim and all the other parties that were still on scene. While speaking with those parties she had an available unit locate the suspect to get her story. After collecting the statement from all parties involved, the decision was made to take the suspect into custody.

7. Problem Solving Skills:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

While speaking with the victim, I advised him that he can take out an Order of Protection against [REDACTED] and told him not to speak with her anymore to help solve this issue.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

On this call deputy Goodwin quickly recognized the problem to be a domestic. After weighing the evidence she solved the problem by making the arrest.

8. Community Specific Problems:

Since domestics are one of the number one answered calls, seeing as it impacts the neighbors around them if it is being heard or if weapons are used.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin recognizes that domestic assaults are one of the most answered calls and how it can impact the community.

9. Cultural Diversity:

There were no ethnic nor language differences.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

No cultural diversity was encountered on this call.

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

Domestic assaults TCA is 39-13-111. If there are visible signs off an assault that has occurred, and if a primary aggressor is determined, an arrest can be made. Both parties are advised of the consequences if an arrest is made. Due to the visible signs of an assault on the victim along with the statements of the witnesses, I had the authority and obligation to make an arrest.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Being a domestic assault with physical signs of assault deputy Goodwin made the arrest using TCA 39-13-111.

11. Individual Rights:

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

In each arrest during a domestic assault, there is a Victim Notification that is filled out to inform the victim when the suspect is released from jail 12 hours after they have been booked in. [REDACTED] was offered medical attention for his injuries.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

On this call deputy Goodwin got the whole story before making the decision for the arrest. She is aware that any time an arrest is made for assault that a victim rights notification is required so that the victim can be notified upon the release of the suspect from custody.

12. Officer Safety:

During a domestic, you always have to keep a calm mindset. Also have a mild tone so the problem doesn't escalate. But if there is high tension, you have to be able to keep control over the situation.

Deputy Goodwin demonstrated good officer safety throughout this call. While enroute to the call she drove emergency traffic but did so in a safe manner. On scene she kept a safe distance during the interview process.

13. Communication Skills:

After arriving on scene, I spoke with the victim in a calm manner to keep him calm. I spoke with the witnesses and made them write statements. Always try to use professional language. I checked the victim over dispatch to see if he was negative through NCIC. As well as the suspect was checked.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

When we received the call deputy Goodwin spoke clearly on the radio as she stepped up to code 3. On scene she asked all the necessary questions to put in her report. She also knows when and how to ask additional units for assistance if needed. Before leaving the scene the victim was notified of his rights.

- Trainee's Comments: What did I learn? What do I still need to know?

I kept the job professional and nothing was done unethical during this procedure and I believe that the decision I made was the best possible. To keep from the situation getting out of hand on into the day.

- PTO Comments: Trainee's performance throughout week. Note areas needing improvement.

Deputy Goodwin acted in a professional manner throughout this call. All parties were treated equally, fair, and with respect.

15. Self Awareness/Life-style stressors:

PBLE #2: Disorderly at Bar Call

You are on solo patrol at 1:00 a.m. You receive a radio call from a bar owner on the opposite side of your patrol area. He reports that an extremely agitated person has destroyed property in the bar and driven off without paying. The owner believes the driver also struck another vehicle in the parking lot as he sped off. The bar owner reports the driver and one female passenger as occupants of the vehicle. You respond to the call and, while en route to the bar, you observe that the suspect's vehicle has struck another car and is stalled in the middle of the road. Both driver and passenger are still in the vehicle. Back-up officers are en route.

Directions for PBLE: Remember, this is an ill-structured problem and does not have a simple solution. You must present to your Police Training Officer two or more possible outcomes for this exercise. In each instance you must include the following:

Ideas – Record initial responses to the problem. What are two separate possible ways you can deal with this situation? Explain them to your PTO.

- What are your initial thoughts on solving this problem?

I would stay with the driver and assist him, make sure he and the female are okay. Get his information and his side of the story. Tell the backup to continue on to the bar. Wait on someone to get to me, and if I notice that he has been drinking, I will perform field sobriety. After speaking with the bar owner, decide whether an arrest needs to be made or not.

- What are the issues?

Possible drunk has destroyed property inside the bar, the male did not pay, and he has left the bar, possibly has left the scene of an accident, male has struck a vehicle in the road.

Facts – List all of the known facts about the problem. For example, there has been at least one motor vehicle accident, a complaint about a bar fight, and the suspects are in a vehicle.

- What do you know?

I know that the bar owner has called in and reported damage to his bar. I know the description of the vehicle and the occupants, I observe the suspect's vehicle in a collision with a vehicle.

- What are your facts?

The driver has left the bar without paying and has destroyed property inside. The description of the vehicle and the occupants. The driver has wrecked into a vehicle.

Learning Issues – Identify the relevant content from the learning matrix for each decision. For example, what laws do you need to know and what are the procedures for vehicle stops and impounding vehicles?

- What do you need to know to solve this problem?

The amount of damage done inside the bar, if the male has hit a vehicle in the parking lot of the bar, if the driver has a valid license. Laws on property damage, hit and runs.

Investigate for the info I need by speaking with all parties, ask dispatch, TCA books.

- Whom should you contact?

A traffic officer, to work the crash.

- What resources are available to solve this problem?

Investigation, dispatch, TCA book.

- What other information do you need?

The amount of the bar tab, the bar owner's information, amount of damage done to the vehicles, both vehicle owners information, their insurance information, the females information that is in the vehicle with the male. Have the on-call wrecker in route.

Action Plans – Create a precise and specific plan for either solving or reducing the problem. Your action plan should arise from what you know about the problem and what your research has taught you. For example, once you speak to a variety of individuals and carry out your research during the "learning issues phase," what plan can you now develop, using the new information you have, to help you deal effectively with this problem?

- What can you do to solve or reduce this problem?

Speak with all parties and get statements from witnesses.

- Do you make arrests?

According to the TCA Laws an arrest could possibly be made.

- Describe the rationale for each decision.

Arresting the male, would result in him being charged with hit and run, property damage, theft of services.

- Describe the possible consequences of each decision in your action plan.

The male may be banned from this bar.

- Describe how you would behave given each set of circumstances.

I would keep it as professional as possible.

These may include a verbal report, a written report, a formal presentation, demonstrations incorporating examples from your patrol work with your PTO, or other methods that best suit your abilities.

Using your matrix, answer the following questions for this problem:

- Trainee comments:

If there is not a traffic officer working, I will learn to get better at a crash report. Traffic codes will definitely help during this incident. This was not an emergency call so there was no use to run lights/sirens.

- PTO comments:

Due to the nature of this call and the fact that the unwanted subject has left the incident scene and that there are no injuries, Deputy Goodwin knows that she would responded non-emergency. Deputy Goodwin also knows that she needs to stay with the accident scene and suspect.

2. Did you initially formulate assumptions (ideas) that you later realized would not work? Explain. Could these assumptions be transferred to another problem? Where?

- Trainee comments:

I did not have any bad ideas during this incident.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin produced good ideas and action plans on this incident.

3. Identify important information or skills that you acquired during this problem-solving exercise. Explain why you choose these (i.e. identify laws, contacts, or behaviors that you will use again).

- Trainee comments:

The traffic TCA book would help for the laws if it is a hit-an-run, if he has no valid driver's license or no insurance for the vehicle. I will have to contact dispatch to put it on the record that whether the bar owner wants him banned or not. These TCA laws will be used throughout this career.

- PTO comment:

Deputy Goodwin seems to be getting better at recognizing the required resources on calls, identifying the proper TCA codes, and paperwork needed.

4. Evaluate your own problem-solving process regarding the listing of known facts, finding answers to questions and devising the action plan. (Did you list all the facts? Did you ask the right questions? What questions would you ask now? Was your action plan realistic and achievable?)

- Trainee comments:

I listed all known facts to my knowledge. I asked all the helpful questions that could have solved the problem. I could ask the subjects if they have been in trouble with the police before. My action plan was realistic and could possibly be achievable.

- PTO comments:

I think Deputy Goodwin has a good action plan to achievable the overall outcome for this incident.

- Trainee comments:

I could do more patrolling around that area where the bar is located. It would be helpful to know who all of the owners of the bar are and have their contacts for the future. Being familiar with the area could also help. Developing more problem solutions from a supervisor could be of some use. Knowing the laws and what I need to do or what I could charge them with at the end of this stop.

- PTO comments:

Deputy Goodwin knows the importance of having good connections in the community and having a good relationship with fellow deputies and supervisors.



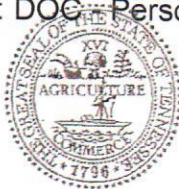

We have a scanner and when she (TIFFANY) is working we listen to it because momma and daddy worry about her. My boys had just laid down, I was on the couch, and my wife was sitting there watching TV. My wife heard TIFFANY come across the scanner saying somebody was outside of our house. We didn't know she (TIFFANY) had pulled up in the driveway. She (TIFFANY) comes home sometimes for dinner or to use the bathroom. My wife told me to get up that TIFFANY was after somebody outside of our house. At that time, I got up, jerked my clothes on, and got my gun out of the cabinet. I went out the back door and stood on the porch. I was listening and looking because I didn't know where she was at. As I turned to go back into the house, I heard pop...pop, pop. I told my wife that either somebody was shooting fireworks or she (TIFFANY) just shot somebody. As I came through the kitchen into the living room, I heard TIFFANY say on the radio shots fired. I came out of the house and went down through the back yards. I came to where the garden was and started hollering her name. I asked TIFFANY if she was all right. She told me she was ok. I could hear TIFFANY telling the guy to stop moving. I told TIFFANY I was going to the road to stop the cops when they arrived. I could hear sirens coming from everywhere. As the officers arrived, I directed them to where TIFFANY was. When all the officers went up to where TIFFANY was; I went back to the house and put my weapon up. I have a carry permit for my weapon.

From the time I heard TIFFANY call it in on the radio until I heard the shots fired, probably two or three minutes had passed. I heard three shots. The boy's daddy came to my house. I did not know he was here. My wife and daughter went out on the porch to talk to him. He didn't cause any problems when he was here. 

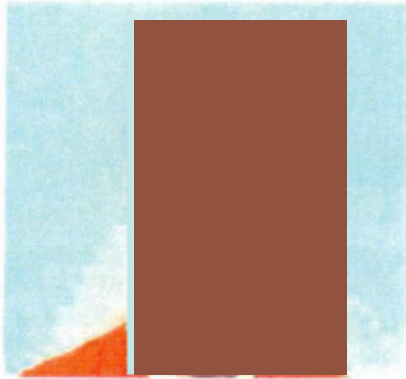
